Copy of a Report of a Committee of the Honorable the PRIVY COUNCIL, approved by His Excellency the Governor General in Council on the 1<sup>st</sup> of August 1871.

On a memorandum dated 27<sup>th</sup> July 1871, from the Honorable the Minister of Militia and Defence, reporting that he has had under consideration the Petition of the Corporation of the City of Kingston praying that permission be granted to the Corporation to open up Montreal, Bagot and Bond-Head Streets through the Artillery Park at Kingston.

That the prayer of the Petitioners may be granted without inconvenience so far as Montreal Street is concerned, but that the opening of Bond-Head and Bagot Streets is decidedly objectionable. That the opening out of these Streets would intersect some of the Buildings of the Park, more particularly those portions now occupied by the Active Militia of Kingston, and would so separate other portions as to render them practically useless for Militia purposes.

On the application from the City of Kingston dated 19 Nov 1875 for the extension of Bagot Street to Bond Head Street through the Gov. Property at that place.

The Hon<sup>ble</sup> Mr. Scott acting in the absence of the Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Minister of Militia & Defence, in a report dated 24 Nov 1875 recommends that all that strip of land titled red and lettered a, b, c, d. on a plan submitted being a portion of the Eastern extremity of the Military Reserve known as the "Cuttler's Park" in the City of Kingston Province of Ontario and containing about 20,460 Supt feet equal to one rod thirty five perches with figured dimensions on the said plan bearing the signature of Charles Walker Surveyor & Draughtsman dated 23 Nov 1875, but without guarantee of exact measurement, be sold at a valuation to be made by competent persons to be appointed for the purpose by the Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Minister of the Interior provided that a substantial fence is put up by the Corporation on the new line of Bagot Street, and the value of the Artillery Stores & the cost of their removal if practicable to the ground on the opposite side of that Street to be added to the purchase money, he further recommends that accordingly all the papers in the case be referred to the Department of the Interior for action. The Committee submit the above recommendation for your Excellency's approval.
